

St. Louis is a major city in Missouri along the Mississippi River. Its iconic, 630-ft. Gateway Arch, built in the 1960s, honors the early 19th-century explorations of Lewis and Clark and America's westward expansion in general. Replica paddlewheelers ply the river, offering views of the arch. St. Louis has the eighth-most professional sports championships among U.S. cities (13 overall championships for five major leagues). The history of St. Louis has been heavily influenced by Westward expansion and blues music.

ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI ATTRACTIONS

GATEWAY ARCH

The Gateway Arch is a 630-foot monument in St. Louis. Clad in stainless steel and built in the form of a weighted catenary arch, it is the world's tallest arch, the tallest man-made monument in the Western Hemisphere, and Missouri's tallest accessible building. From the thrilling views to the amazing stories, a visit to the Gateway Arch is an experience that never fails to inspire. Whether you have a few hours or a full day, you'll find activities to please every member of your party. Attractions include the Tram Ride to the Top of the Gateway Arch, the Museum at the Gateway Arch, a documentary film about the construction of the Arch, shopping at The Arch Store, a new Arch Cafe, and cruises aboard the Riverboats at the Gateway Arch.

GATEWAY ARCH NATIONAL PARK



The Gateway Arch National Park, formerly known as the Jefferson National Expansion Memorial until 2018, is an American national park located in St. Louis, near the starting point of the Lewis and Clark Expedition. The park honors Jefferson's role in western expansion, featuring the Gateway Arch & visitors' center.

FOREST PARK



Forest Park is a public park in western St. Louis. It is a prominent civic center and covers 1,371 acres. Opened in 1876, more than a decade after its proposal, the park has

hosted several significant events, including the Louisiana Purchase Exposition of 1904 and the 1904 Summer Olympics. It is America's second largest urban park.

ST. LOUIS ZOO

The Saint Louis Zoological Park, commonly known as the Saint Louis Zoo, is in Forest Park in St. Louis. It is recognized as a leading zoo in animal management, research, conservation, and education. The zoo is accredited by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums. It has 6,600 animals and 15 major exhibit areas.

MISSOURI BOTANICAL GARDEN

The Missouri Botanical Garden is a botanical garden is known informally as Shaw's Garden for founder and phi-

lanthropist Henry Shaw. Today, the Garden is a National Historic Landmark and a center for science, conservation, education and horticultural display - widely considered one of the top three botanical gardens in the world. It features 79 acres



of horticultural displays, including indoor conservatories and demonstration, formal and international gardens.

CATHEDRAL BASILICA OF SAINT LOUIS



The Cathedral Basilica of Saint Louis, also known as the Saint Louis Cathedral, is a cathedral of the Roman Catholic Church The Mother Church of the Archdiocese of Saint Louis, the superstructure of the Cathedral was built be-

tween 1907 and 1914. It is known for its' beautiful interior mosaics, which took nearly 80 years to create using more

than 41 million pieces of glass tesserae. The Cathedral is known for having one of the largest mosaic collections in the Western Hemisphere.

SAINT LOUIS ART MUSEUM



The Saint Louis Art Museum is one of the principal U.S. art museums, with paintings, sculptures, cultural objects, and ancient masterpieces from all corners of the world. Its three-story building stands in Forest Park in St. Louis, where it is visited by up to a half million people every year.

BUSCH STADIUM



Busch Stadium, also referred to informally as "New Busch Stadium" or "Busch Stadium III", is the baseball park home of the St. Louis Cardinals, the city's Ma-

jor League Baseball franchise. The stadium seats 44,494, contains 3,706 club seats, and 61 luxury suites.

ANHEUSER-BUSCH ST. LOUIS BREWERY

Historic brewery featuring various tours, a beer museum, a biergarten, a gift shop & classes. With celebrated venues like The Biergarten and signature experiences like the Day Fresh and Beermaster Tours, there's always something new to discover when you visit.

MAGIC HOUSE

The Magic House children's museum in Kirkwood is located, just outside St. Louis. It offers kids many handson learning activities and provides a special area for younger children.



SWEETIE PIE'S RESTAURANT

Sweetie Pie's is a soul food restaurant owned by Robbie Montgomery, a 1960s backup singer and former "Ikette." It was featured in a docuseries on cable TV OWN channel.







SOME NEIGHBORHOOD HIGHLIGHTS

CENTRAL WEST END

This trendy neighborhood has a mix of restaurants, pubs, shops, nightspots and inviting sidewalk cafes, nestled along the edge of St. Louis' treasure gem - Forest Park that includes the world famous Zoo, Art Museum, The Muny Opera, and History Museum. In the CWE you can catch a movie at The Chase Park Plaza and are just minutes away from the St. Louis Science Center.

GRAND CENTER

This cultural hub of the region is home to thousands of theatre seats, 1,500 cultural events and a dozen galleries and museums. Attractions include the Saint Louis Symphony Orchestra, the Fabulous Fox Theatre, KDHX's The Stage, Sheldon Concert Hall and Art Galleries, Contemporary Art Museum, St. Louis, Pulitzer Foundation for the Arts, Jazz at the Bistro, The International Photography Hall of Fame and more.

THE GROVE

The Grove is a burgeoning new residential/commercial district that features a variety of independent restaurants, shops, galleries and bars centered along Manchester Avenue, east of Kingshighway.

SOULARD

Soulard is St. Louis' oldest neighborhood. Its streets are lined with red-brick townhomes, live music clubs and unique restaurants. But it really comes alive during Mardi Gras, rivaling New Orleans in its revelry. Attractions include the Anheuser-Busch Brewery, Soulard Farmers Market.

SOUTH GRAND

St. Louis is home to people from around the world, and the Grand South Grand area represents our international roots and the dreams of immigrants from Ethiopia, Vietnam, Thailand and the Middle East, and European nations, to name a few. Attractions include many ethnic eateries and shops and Tower Grove Park.

Chapter Checks and Money Orders will be accepted. Please make checks or money orders payable to National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Inc. You may complete the Registration through your Chapter or register individually by Check, Credit/Bank Card, or CASH App payments through our National Headquarters and/or the Conclave Website.

CANCELLATION REQUEST and REFUND POLICY

All Registration Fees paid on or before the deadline are refundable. Please be aware that a Cancellation Fee will be deducted from the registration and/or ticket amount paid. All funds for approved for cancellation requests will be reimbursed within ninety (90) days after the conclusion of Conclave. Emergency Cancellation Requests will be reviewed individually when accompanied by a letter written to Headquarters accompanied by proper documentation from the Chapter Basileus. The amount of the approved refund will be considered based on the Postmark Date of the request. See the chart below for Refund Amount Percentage for lost revenue.

NO SHOW POLICY

No refunds will be granted when a Registered Soror does not show up for the Conclave. The exception will be a documented emergency, which will be considered on an individual case by case basis. The Conclave Materials packet for the absent Soror will be given to the Chapter Basileus if a Refund was not requested in accordance with the Cancellation and Refund Policy.

REGISTRATION TRANSFER POLICY

The Registration Fee will be transferred from one Registered Soror to another only with a written request from the Chapter Basileus and Chapter Tamiouchos and signed request from the two members, prior to the start of Conclave. A Soror may request a Transfer of Registration to another Soror to avoid the cancellation fee. The Soror must be in good financial standing. A letter must be sent to Headquarters requesting the Transfer of Registration.
